## Saints and Popes Speak on Mission Reflections, Insights, and Challenges

**Introduction.** The following forty quotes from a vast panorama of sources provide helpful insights into the Church's mission of evangelization. They can be used in a variety of ways: in conjunction with the twelve thematic mission modules; as points of discussion during formation sessions; or, as a focus for a prayer session or reflection paper. Other creative uses may also emerge: asking people to identify two or three of their favorite quotes. The quotes are randomly presented; no hierarchy of importance is implied; the numbering is only for clarity and easy reference. May you be inspired as you reflect on these beautiful mission insights!

1. "The task of evangelizing all people constitutes the essential mission of the Church.... Evangelizing is in fact the grace and vocation proper to the Church, her deepest identity. She exists in order to evangelize." ▶ Pope Paul VI (EN 14)

(2) Only for today, I will take the greatest care of my appearance: I will dress modestly, I will not raise my voice; I will be courteous in my behavior; I will not criticize anyone; I will not claim to improve or to discipline anyone except myself. (3) Only for today, I will be happy in the certainty that I was created to be happy, not only in the other world but also in this one. (4) Only for today, I will adapt to circumstances, without requiring all circumstances to be adapted to my own wishes. (5) Only for today, I will devote ten minutes of my time to some good reading, remembering that just as food is necessary to the life of the body, so good reading is necessary to the life of the soul. (6) Only for today, I will do one good deed and not tell anyone about it. (7) Only for today, I will do at least one thing I do not like doing; and if my feelings are hurt, I will make sure that no one notices. (8) Only for today, I will make a plan for myself; I may not follow it to the letter, but I will make it. And, I will be on guard against two evils: hastiness and indecision. (9) Only for today, I will firmly believe, despite appearances, that the good providence of God cares for me as no one else who exists in this world. (10) Only for today, I will have no fears. In particular, I will not be afraid to enjoy what is beautiful and to believe in goodness. Indeed, for twelve hours I can certainly do what might cause me consternation were I to believe I had to do it all my life. To conclude: here is an all-embracing resolution: "I want to be kind, today and always, to everyone." ► Saint John XXIII
- **29.** *Generosity* **Prayer.** "Dear Lord, teach me to be generous; teach me to serve you as you deserve, to give and not to count the cost, to fight and not to heed the wounds, to toil and not to seek for rest, to labor and not to ask for reward, save that of knowing that I do your will.
